



Vision & Values




Why do you attend in-person Sunday services?




What do you want in a sermon?




What type of music do you like during an in-person service?




Is providing service/activities aimed at children and youth important?




We presently offer some child activities during the Sunday service and a separate Dinner Church. We should invest in expanding activities aimed at children and youth.




A midweek service is posted online. Which of the comments apply to you?



There are other services such as Faith and Coffee, grief support group, book club, and movie club.




The Minister's leadership in baptism, confirmation, weddings and funerals is important.




Hospitality and Congregational Care


The Hospitality team provides refreshments for Sunday in-person services and other events. Is this an important part of the experience attending the service/event?




On The Edge concert series and other music events add to the feel of community (in addition to being fundraisers).



I have been a recipient of Congregational Care and, for me, it has been...




Congregational Care activities (e.g. visitation, meals, transportation, Home Magazine, support during life events) are an important part of what we do.




Social Justice and Community Engagement


I prefer to keep my involvement low key, such as donating money or contributing excess food.



I prefer hands-on involvement, such as volunteering at a social service agency.




Currently the church building hosts a nature kindergarten. Our building should become more extensively utilized by hosting social service agencies serving the growing communities around our location.




I am well informed of upcoming events via the Thursday newsletter, website, Facebook, and announcements during the Sunday in-person & midweek virtual services.




I am relatively new to the church, and have found the welcoming & orientation information helpful.
